Fire Tower Hike Series

Four hikers enjoyed our second outing of the Fire Tower Series to **Hunter Mountain** on Friday June 23. We did an 8 mile loop from the trailheads on Spruceton Road. The weather cooperated and we enjoyed a hydration stop at Westkill brewery following the hike.

Our next hike will be to the tower on **Red Hill Mountain** on **Friday July 14**.

The DEC's Fire Tower Challenge encourages hikers to visit the 6 remaining fire

towers in the Catskills. The challenge involves visiting all towers between January 1, 2023, and December 31, 2023. You do not need to climb up to the cab which are typically open when staffed by volunteers between Memorial Day and Columbus Day on weekends.

For those who complete and report their accomplishment, they will receive a letter and commemorative patch. In addition, the first 1000 to complete the challenge will receive a complementary subscription to The Conservationist magazine. As there is a car entry fee we can carpool from McDonald's in Saugerties meeting at 9:15. There are numerous hiking options ranging from a walk around the lake to out and back hikes to various popular destinations with beautiful views - Artists Rock, Sunset Rock, or North Point as the usual final destination - so you can select whatever distance you are comfortable with. Bring proper hiking shoes, water and clothing.

Cycle to Breakfast - Sunday July 16, Ashokan Rail trail

This will be mainly on the rail trail with a short ride on route 28 to Bread Alone. You can choose to ride a longer or shorter distance with both groups meeting up to head to Bread Alone.

The longer ride will be about 25 miles round trip and start at the rail trail parking area closest to Kingston. The entrance is on the left side of 28 just beyond the West Hurley Stewart's traffic light/intersection. **Wheels down at 8 am so arrive in time to get organized.**

The second option will be to ride about 10 miles round trip starting from the Ashokan Station trailhead parking lot visible from 28 also on the left side. There's a sign reading "Former site of Olive". **Plan to be there by 8:30, ready to ride by 9.** The first group will stop there, and the combined group will then ride to the end of the rail trail in Boiceville and up 28 a short distance to Bread Alone.
