Board Meeting Minutes - October 10, 2023

A meeting of the Trailsweepers Snow and Sports Club Board of Directors was called to order by Dale Ziegenfelder. Present: Kathie Quick, Skip Alford.

The board reviewed the proposed Kickoff Party terms and conditions. It decided that the close date proximity of the deposit return and potential loss of 50% of the deposit or being liable for the entire amount of the dinner without 45 persons attending was too great a financial risk for the club, and therefore declined to sanction the event. It was thought that we could try it at some other time with more time to advertise and collect deposits. Submitted by Dale Ziegenfelder

Regular Meeting -

In President Rob Fletcher's absence, the meeting was called to order by EVP Jeff Huth at 7:05pm. Twenty members were in attendance thus ensuring a quorum for the two votes taken that evening. Dale Ziegenfelder led the attendees through a discussion of the

versus using some of the funds to offset the cost of Club activities. There was a motion made from the floor and carried with a majority vote to increase the budget allocation for the Spring Banquet to \$ 2000 with a portion to be allocated to an offset of the cost to attend. The modified budget was then approved by a majority vote. Following a brief discussion, the proposed by-law changes to a) grant authority to the Board to approve cost overruns of **budgeted** items up to 15% over budget and b) to raise the financial hurdle for non-budgeted items to be voted on by the membership was approved by majority vote.

Following the votes, the attendees discussed upcoming outdoor activities and social events - balsam lake mountain fire tower hike 10/27, happy hours (suggest new venues to Ellen B.), possible holiday cookie bake-off, and after the holidays dinner planned by Lisa O. There was also a discussion of the outcome of a communication working group (see next item) and ideas for attracting new members for the Club which sponsors so many sporting activities and social events. The latter should be an on-going topic.

Communications Working Group

A small group (Jeff Huth, Jean Pavone, Katie Viglielmo and CaroleTomassetti) held a zoom meeting to discuss current communication efforts and opportunities to enhance them. We briefly discussed those that are generally oriented towards current members – Newsletters, President's emails and the website. We then discussed the Club's social media presence also applicable for internal communication but perhaps more important as a way to increase awareness of the Club and potentially attract new members.

Trailsweepers has had a Facebook page for a number of years and also have an Instagram page set up last year by Katie V. since it was felt that the two platforms are used by different demographic groups (primarily based on age) and that we might reach a broader segment of potential members by also having an Instagram page.

We discussed the importance of regular posting to the social media accounts and using a communication campaign approach - post about the event ahead of time, share photos after the event and encourage members to "like", "tag" participants and/or add comments to the posting. This will generate more attention and ensure that the social media pages appear in web-based searches along with the Club website when someone may be searching for e.g. "Ski or Sports Clubs in The Hudson Valley".

We agreed that we should be posting about Happy Hours, Meetings, Informational Programs, Hikes, Kayaking events, and major social events such as the Almost Summer

agreed to look into ways to facilitate automatic sharing of common content across both platforms and to make it easier for members to make content available to the editors.
