Membership – 112 paid 2025 members. Diana Z noted that this is a gain of 4.

<u>50/50-</u> This has been run by Skip Alford for a number of years. It's a real effective and useful fundraiser. It is time to pass the baton. Rob F is issuing a call out for a new Coordinator of this important opportunity. Skip was toasted and thanked for his work and he volunteered to assist in the baton pass. <u>Kayak</u>- On 6/28 we held a launch on Chodikee Lake. We had a beautiful clear day 6 or so paddlers and no problems.

We held the Kayak Instructional Day on 6/28 with 5 paddlers, which is the maximum # for an effective training session for the instructor. We had more applicants than slots. We hope to do this again. It was just so much fun and really great skills training.

The topic chosen by the group was "The anatomy of the turn". We paddled in an enclosed 2 acre cove next to the Hudson for about 3 hours.

The next launch is on 7/7 – Ramshorn from a Catskill launch.
